1. Read <b>John 6:31</b> . What are some things you once considered of ultimate importance in life that you now have a different view of after coming to faith in Christ? How has Christ transformed your view of these things you once considered to be supremely important?
2. Read <b>John 17:10-17</b> . What is Jesus praying for as he prays for his disciples (and us) in this text? Also, consider <b>Hebrews 7:23-25</b> . What does it do for your confidence to know that Jesus is praying for you and your endurance even now? In what situation do you feel the greatest need for that presently?
3. Read <b>John 6:38-40</b> and <b>Matthew 26:38-44</b> . How can we reconcile these two passages? What do we do with Jesus' request that the cup should pass from him, but his insistence in John 6 that he had come to do the will of the Father? Did he not know that the only way John 6:38-40 would be possible was through the cross? If he did, what are we to do with this scene in Gethsemane?

4. Read **John 6:39-40**. If this is our certain future as believers, how should we approach the temporal issues of this world, like political elections, retirement investments, and the education of our children? In other words, how should this future reality impact how we think about these things the world considers so important?
