Discussion Questions

1. Read **1 Corinthians 1:18-25**. What about the gospel did you find most difficult to believe prior to being saved? Why did God choose to use a message the world would find foolish, a message the wisdom of the world would fail to comprehend? How should this impact our testimonies when we share the gospel with others?

2. Considering **1 Corinthians 1:18-25**, what place should apologetics have in our arsenal as Christian evangelists? Is there a responsibility that we bear as Christians to be able to engage in apologetic arguments while evangelizing? Why or why not?

3. Read **John 6:44**, **1 Timothy 1:12-16**, and **Acts 22:3**. As you consider Paul's testimony and his life before Christ, what are some ways we might see God drawing him or calling him to himself as he prepared him even then for his life of service as an Apostle? Looking back at your own life before Christ, what are some ways God may have been drawing you even before you were aware of it?

4. Read **John 6:27, 35, 47-51**. Note Jesus's patience throughout this whole interaction, continually calling his opponents to believe. Do you find it easier to be patient with yourself or patient with others? Why? Why is it necessary that we employ a patient spirit as we interact with unbelievers?
