Discussion Questions

Community Groups meet throughout the week and play a crucial role in our response to the preaching of the word. These groups gather to discuss the following questions as we seek to apply the sermon in community with one another. Please visit compassntx.org to join a small group near you.

1. Considering the cessationist view that miraculous gifts were specific to the apostolic era, how should we interpret Jesus' healing of the blind man in **John 9:6-7** today? What was the purpose of such miracles during Jesus' time, and what is their relevance for us now?

2. **John 9:3** suggests that the man's blindness was used by God for a greater purpose. How does our understanding of suffering change when we view our challenges as opportunities for God's work to be displayed in us? Can you share a personal experience where you saw a difficult situation used for God's glory?

3. Read **Matthew 25:14-30**. How does the concept of stewardship, discussed in the sermon, connect this parable to our passage in John 9? How can we be more faithful in the freedoms we have to make sure we aren't like the wicked servant in this parable? Did it matter that he didn't have as much to steward as the other two? Does it matter that you might not have as much to steward (as many gifts) as someone else?

4. The man in John 9 gradually comes to a fuller understanding of who Jesus is—from thinking of Him as a mere healer to recognizing Him as "Lord" and worshiping Him (**John 9:38**). How do we, as modern believers, grow in our understanding of Christ? What processes or practices will you engage in to deepen your theological insights and relationship with Jesus?
