





## John 12:12-19 | Here Comes the King

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## **Discussion Questions**

Community Groups meet throughout the week and play a crucial role in our response to the preaching of the word. These groups gather to discuss the following questions as we seek to apply the sermon in community with one another. Please visit compassntx.org to join a small group near you.

1. Read <b>John 12:13</b> and <b>Psalm 118:25-26</b> . The crowds expected a political and military leader who would free them from Roman oppression, but Jesus had a different kind of kingdom in mind. Where do we see similar misunderstandings today about the role of Jesus and His teachings in the political and social spheres? How can we guard against such misunderstandings creeping into our church?
2. Read <b>John 12:14-15</b> and <b>Zechariah 9:9-11</b> . Do you think the crowds should have understood the type of Messiah/King that Jesus was coming to be as He entered Jerusalem in fulfillment of this prophecy? If not, why do you think He chose to do this?
3. Read <b>John 12:14-15</b> and <b>Acts 2:36</b> . Reflect on the different areas of life mentioned in the sermon (family, work, education, etc.). Are there areas of your life where it's difficult to recognize Jesus as King? What practical steps can you take to surrender these areas more fully to Him?
4. Read <b>John 12:17-19</b> . How does Christ as our Victor encourage you in your walk in the areas of godliness, boldness, zeal, and faith?
