Discussion Questions

1. Read John 17:20-23 and Philippians 2:1-2 . How does the church's unity serve to further her mission to reach lost people with the good news of the gospel? As the Lord continues to grow this body of believers, how can we ensure that we maintain the unity that we have enjoyed so far?
2. Read Titus 3:10 . How does division within the body of Christ undermine the power of the gospel? In other words, how is a divisive spirit anti-gospel?
3. Read John 17:24 and Matthew 17:4-2 . How should our future with Christ help us remain unified here and now? How does that future help overcome the threats to our unity that may arise from our fleshly desires?

4. Read **John 17:25-26** and **Colossians 3:12-14**. Why does Paul say that love binds everything together in perfect harmony? What is the nature of this love? Why is it that we can't have the unity Christ is praying we would experience without this kind of love?
