## Application Questions

1. How has Habakkuk challenged or deepened your understanding of the sovereignty of God?
2. Read **Habakkuk 1:13**. How is trusting God's sovereignty better than embracing a perspective that would suggest He is powerless over the evil and wickedness of this world? How is God's sovereignty over the trials you have experienced comforting to you as opposed to the idea that He is as surprised by them as you are?
3. Read **Habakkuk 3:17-19**. What attributes of God provide you comfort in the face of trials and suffering? What are the past examples of His faithfulness to you that keep you trusting during the difficult times?
4. What are some of the messages of hope that are found in the book of Habakkuk? How do these encourage us still today?
5. How might you utilize the book of Habakkuk to counsel a brother or sister who is grumbling about their lot in life (e.g., their marriage, their job situation, their health prognosis)?
