1. Read <b>1 Peter 2:11</b> and <b>2 Corinthians 4:16-5:10</b> . How can a Christian know if he/she is too comfortable in this world? Right now, would you say that you would rather depart and be with Jesus than remain here for the next 10, 15, 20 years of your life? How can I enjoy my family, life, gifts from the Lord, and still say with Paul that I'd rather be with Jesus?
2. Read <b>1 Peter 2:11</b> and <b>Galatians 5:24</b> . If our flesh has been crucified with Christ Jesus along with its passions and desires, why do we still find ourselves battling those same passions and desires that wage war against our souls?
3. Read <b>1 Peter 2:12</b> and <b>John 15:18-21</b> . If Jesus told us the world would hate us because it hates him, why should we bother with what they think about us in the first place?

# 4. Read **1 Peter 2:12** and **Ephesians 6:12**. How can a daily reminder that our enemies are not flesh and blood help you keep your conduct honorable among the lost even when they hate you for your faith in Christ?
