1. Read **Hebrews 10:24-25** and **1 Thess 5:11**. What are some ways you have been encouraged in your faith by the faith of other brothers and sisters in Christ in the local church?

2. Read **Rom 13:12**; **James 5:8**; and **1 Peter 4:7**. How do these passages use the imminence of the day of the Lord to encourage and exhort the reader? How should we be encouraging and exhorting each other in light of the impending return of Jesus?

3. Read **Hebrews 10:24** and **1 Peter 2:22**. In running our race, we need people to help us keep the pace. How have you experienced that loving, sanctified irritation from brothers and sisters in the local church? What makes this verse such a compelling argument for the necessity of connecting in community?

4. What reasons have you heard or perhaps given for why someone might not want this level of connection in the local church? When you consider the overall picture of the local church in the New Testament and the commitment demonstrated and called for, how would you say we're doing as a church? How are you doing in your commitment to the community here at Compass, and how can you take the next steps to get even more connected?
