## Application Questions

1. Read **Psalm 119:89-91**. Why should you seek to know more about who God is and his character? If God is who he says he is and his words are fixed, then how should that change how you live?
2. Focus on **Psalm 119:90**. How is God able to be perfectly faithful to all generations? Give some practical examples of what your life would be like if God wasn't faithful in such a way.
3. Read **Psalm 119:92-93**. God has spoken to us, but how do you remind yourself of what he's said? What happens when you remind yourself of the gospel after you have sinned? What happens when you remind yourself of the gospel when you are having a good day?
4. Read **Matthew 11:28-29** and **Revelation 21:3-4**. How is it possible that these promises aren't just wishful thinking from God? How are these promises absolutely sure? What is one habit you can start developing this week to remind yourself of his sure promises?
